I. Arts & Humanities

A. Visual and Performing Arts (3 units)

Recommended: ART 380 or MUS 433

Also Accepted: Any 3-unit upper-division course in the departments of Art, Music, Theatre, and Dance

B. Language and Literature (3 units):

Recommended: ENGL/LING 206 or ENGL 341 or THTR 311 or ENGL 211 or ENGL 212 or ENGL 221 or ENGL 222

Also Accepted: Any 3-unit upper-division course in the departments of English, Comparative Literature, and Linguistics; European Studies; and Modern Languages and Literatures

II. Mathematics & Natural Sciences

A. Mathematics (3 units)

Required: MATH 303B

B. Natural Sciences (3 units)

Required: GEOL 410 or BIOL 453

III. Social Sciences & Cultural Diversity

A. Social Sciences (3 units)

Recommended: ANTH 333 or ANTH 350 or PSYC 311 or SOCI 352

Also Accepted: Any 3-unit upper-division course in the departments of Anthropology, Economics, Geography, History, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Religious Studies, and Sociology

B. Cultural Diversity (3 units)

Recommended: AFAM 304 or AFAM 370 or AMST 395 or ASAM 342 or CHIC 305 or CHIC 331 or HCOM 320 or SOCI 357 or WGST 302

Also Accepted: Any 3-unit upper-division course that meets the CSUF GE Cultural Diversity Requirement (Z) in the departments of American Studies, African American Studies, Asian American Studies, Chicana/Chicano Studies, Human Communication, Latin American Studies, and Women & Gender Studies

IV. Elective (3 units)

Recommended: MATH 303A.

Also Accepted: Any 3-unit upper-division course in the departments of Biological Science, Chemistry and Biochemistry, Geology, Mathematics, Physics, and any department listed under I or III above

REGISTRATION ADVICE FOR YOUR JUNIOR AND SENIOR YEARS

CORE COURSES: *In the first semester that you take upper-division courses (typically your junior year), begin with LBST 300 and LBST 302A. You must complete these courses before taking LBST 302B in your second semester.*

First Semester:

- ◆ LBST 300 Introduction to Liberal Studies
- ◆ LBST 302A Historical Dimension of Liberal Studies

During your first or second semester, you should also take

- ◆ LBST 301 Inquiry and Composition in Liberal Studies

Second Semester:

- ◆ LBST 302B Historical Dimension of Liberal Studies
- ◆ One Interdisciplinary Studies Course: LBST 310, 315, 322, 323, 330, 331, 333, 335, 337, 340, or 341

LBST 301 and LBST 302B are prerequisites for the third semester courses LBST 303, 304, and 305.

Third Semester:

- ◆ LBST 303 Liberal Studies in the Humanities and Arts
- ◆ LBST 304 Liberal Studies in the Sciences
- ◆ LBST 305 Liberal Studies in the Social Sciences

Before taking LBST 401, you must complete either LBST 303 and LBST 304 or LBST 304 and LBST 305. The senior seminars have various prerequisites as well.

Fourth Semester:

- ◆ LBST 401 Knowledge in the Arts and Sciences
- ◆ One Senior Seminar: LBST 485, 486, 487, 488, 489, 490, 491, or 492

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION EMPHASIS: *Take your emphasis courses in any order during the semesters that you are taking the core courses.*

GENERAL EDUCATION: *Should you need to take additional General Education courses, we recommend that you consult a Liberal Studies advisor before enrolling.*
