<b>Interdisciplinary Studies Concentration (18 Units)</b>
<p><b>Description:</b>                      15 units of upper-division “theme” courses and 3 units of a senior research project (18 units total). Theme is chosen by student in consultation with LBST faculty advisor.</p> <p>Interdisciplinary Students use their theme to pursue an academic/research interest, career goal, and/or graduate school preparation. Check LBST Department website for sample thematic plans or pre-designed thematic advising tracks.</p> <p><b>Instructions:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No more than 9 units from a single department.</li> <li>• No more than 12 units in one area of study (natural sciences, arts &amp; humanities, social sciences).</li> <li>• An additional LBST Interdisciplinary Course (LBST 310-341) can be used as a theme course AFTER the Interdisciplinary Core Requirement is satisfied.</li> </ul>

<b>LBST SENIOR RESEARCH PROJECT (3 units)</b>	
<p><b>Description:</b>            Class #6 in this Concentration is the senior research project, which is completed in the student’s fourth year in line with their core classes. Students have <u>TWO OPTIONS</u> to complete their research project.</p> <p><b>Option 1: LBST 482</b>            In Year 4, enroll in LBST 482 – Interdisciplinary Thematic Research Seminar (3 units). This course is only offered in Spring semester. Student takes the course with other LBST majors that are each working on their own separate research projects under the guidance of the faculty. Research project is completed in ONE semester.</p> <p><b>Option 2: LBST 499</b>            In Year 4, enroll in LBST 499 – Independent Study in final two semesters with a LBST faculty advisor of your choice (3 units total). In second-to-last semester, student enrolls in LBST 499 (1 unit) to develop research proposal 1-on-1 with a LBST faculty advisor. In final semester, student enrolls in LBST 499 (2 units) with the same faculty to complete proposed research project.</p> <p>Alternatively, students can enroll in one semester of LBST 499 (3 units) with their LBST faculty advisor if approved by faculty. Research project is completed across ONE or TWO semesters.</p>
