<b>INTERDISCIPLINARY THEME: PRE-LAW (21 Units)</b>	
<b>Description:</b>	
<p>The LBST Pre-Law Theme is a pre-designed plan for Interdisciplinary students to complete their Emphasis. This thematic plan combines the LBST Core courses with theme courses in legal and policy issues and other skills useful for careers in law, public policy, or human rights advocacy.</p> <p>When declaring your emphasis, select the “Interdisciplinary Thematic Emphasis.” Choose your 6 theme classes from the list below. Theme courses are broken up into 3 categories to ensure you hit multiple academic disciplines represented in Liberal Studies. Take one course from each area and any additional courses to add up to 18 units total of thematic coursework. For your LBST research project, meet with a LBST faculty member to discuss researching a legal or public policy issue of your choice.</p>

<b>NOTE:</b>

<b>LBST SENIOR RESEARCH PROJECT (3 units)</b>	
<b>Description:</b>	
Class #7 in the ITE is the senior research project, which is completed in the student’s fourth year in line with their core classes. Students have <u>TWO OPTIONS</u> to complete their research project.	
<b>Option 1: LBST 482</b>	
In Year 4, enroll in LBST 482 – Interdisciplinary Thematic Research Seminar (3 units). This course is only offered in Spring semester. Student takes the course with other LBST majors that are each working on their own separate research projects under the guidance of the faculty. Research project is completed in ONE semester.	
<b>Option 2: LBST 499</b>	
In Year 4, enroll in LBST 499 – Independent Study in final two semesters with a LBST faculty advisor of your choice (3 units total). In second-to-last semester, student enrolls in LBST 499 (1 unit) to develop research proposal 1-on-1 with a LBST faculty advisor. In final semester, student enrolls in LBST 499 (2 units) with the same faculty to complete proposed research project.	
Alternatively, students can enroll in one semester of LBST 499 (3 units) with their LBST faculty advisor if approved by faculty. Research project is completed across ONE or TWO semesters.
