I. Personalized Coordinated Program (18 Units)

The Personalized Coordinated Program consists of 18 units of upper-division courses that relate to the Interdisciplinary Theme. Both theme and courses are chosen in consultation with and have to be approved by a Liberal Studies advisor. To promote an interdisciplinary approach, no more than 9 units of coursework may be taken from a single CSUF department and no more than 15 units may fall into any one of the three Liberal Studies knowledge areas of arts & humanities, natural sciences, and social sciences. The courses may be taken in any order.

II. Interdisciplinary Research Project (3 units)

The Interdisciplinary Research Project, which may be a research paper or a creative project in the arts and humanities, natural sciences, or social sciences, must be related to the Interdisciplinary Theme. The project can be carried out by taking either LBST 482 Interdisciplinary Research Seminar or 499 Independent Study with any CSUF full-time faculty member as the project supervisor.

LBST 482 is usually taken in the student's last semester. Its prerequisites are LBST 302A, LBST 302B, LBST 301, LBST 303, LBST 304, and LBST 305.

499 Independent Study is usually taken over the student's last two semesters. In the second-to-last semester, the student takes one unit to develop the Interdisciplinary Research Project Proposal, which must include a clear description of the topic, a well-defined research plan, an annotated bibliography, and a specific and realistic completion schedule, and be approved by both the project supervisor and the Liberal Studies advisor. In the last semester, the student takes two further units of 499 to carry out the project. If warranted by special circumstances, a student may take all three units of 499 in a single semester with the approval of both project supervisor and Liberal Studies advisor.
