"GE C.3/C.4" means the course counts for C.3, if your catalog year is Spring 2018 or earlier or Fall 2019 or later, and counts for C.4, if your catalog year is Fall 2018 or Spring 2019. "GE D.4/D.5" means the course counts for D.4, if your catalog year is Fall 2018 or later, and counts for D.5, if your catalog year is Spring 2018 or earlier.</i>
